Instructions for Permit Applications

1. All information must be printed legibly.
2. Owner name, mailing address and phone number.
3. Location and address of work site.
4. Complete description of work to be done.
5. Number of fixtures, appliances and equipment to be installed.
6. Plans must be submitted on all new buildings and major renovations.

**Notes:**

It is the responsibility of all contractors, electricians and plumbers to obtain the necessary permits from the Code Enforcement office at Municipal Building *before* any work has begun. Work must begin within six (6) months of the issuance of any permit.

Permits are non-transferable. If this is an “After the Fact” permit, it will be subject to a fee two times the normal permit fee.

Contractors must have a valid license from the State of New Hampshire to obtain a permit. Permits are not transferable.

It is the responsibility of the contractor to obtain all inspections required. A rough-in inspection is required before any work is covered, and a final inspection is required when all work is complete. A Notice is required for any inspection. *This signed application constitutes consent on the applicant’s part to allow for all inspections at the property location listed.*

No permit will be issued until all of the above information is furnished, and all the above conditions met.

**Statement of compliance:**
