Local Success Story: Businesses are Flowing In! Utilizing the Community Revitalization Tax Relief Incentive Program

Farmington recently welcomed three new businesses as part of a redevelopment project in the Village Center. This historic building located at 445 Main Street, welcomed Nomad Studios, Delectable Designs, WK Hair Bar and The **Barber Shop** as the latest arrivals in a series of businesses starting up or relocating to town. The property was purchased by Jason Lauze in May 2019 with the goal of revitalizing the building and encouraging economic growth in the downtown. The building was constructed in 1896 and prior to renovations was vacant, in disrepair, and unable to be rented. While planning for the adaptive reuse of the property, Mr. Lauze took advantage of a Community Revitalization Tax Relief Incentive, authorized through this program, RSA 79-E, to help offset costs incurred to improve the building. RSA 79-E is a program that encourages property owners to rehabilitate underutilized buildings in historic downtowns or village centers.

In exchange for such an investment, the property tax shall not increase as a result of the improvements for a finite period determined by the governing body. Farmington, when adopting the provisions of RSA 79-E grants the authority to the Board of Selectmen to accept and review applications for tax relief at any time. To assist with the review and evaluation process for qualifying structures, applicants must demonstrate that the property meets the following criteria: be in the downtown Village Center; undertake a substantial rehabilitation of the structure of at least \$75,000 or 15% of the structure's assessed value, whichever is less; and result in a public benefit for the community. At a recent Economic Development Committee (EDC) meeting, Mr. Lauze speculated that the program may not be widely known, especially within the business community, and suggested that additional outreach is needed to determine if there are other buildings in the downtown that may qualify. He continued by saying that in addition to RSA 79-E, there are other state grants and rebate programs for improving energy efficiency and implementing weatherization efforts that property owners should explore. Mr. Lauze concluded by telling the EDC that without this type of investment many buildings in the downtown would remain unoccupied. The Conley Farm

The <u>Conley Tree Farm</u> has been growing quality Fir Christmas trees since 1968. The farm has nearly 400 acres with approximately 80 acres in tree production. They plant quality northern grown transplants every year to help ensure a continuous supply of trees. The Conley Tree Farm sits a little over 700ft above sea level. The trees are sheltered by Blue Job and Hussey Mountains. The fields and trees are kept moist by natural springs running off of Hussey Mountain. These are just a few of the key factors that set their farm apart from other growers in Southern New Hampshire.





Enjoy scenic views from the farm while choosing the perfect tree with your family for the Holidays. Warm yourself with a savory bite or refreshing beverage to fuel your holiday cheer from Koz's Haute Box, an on-site food truck, featuring New England Soul Food and Bar! Sundance Farm

The house and land on <u>Sundance Farm</u> began around the time our country was born. The original structure built by colonials - some of whom were born as subjects of the British crown - stands today, surrounded by newer additions - and the ever-bearing land. Today the farm is a serene and scenic mix of fields and woods on 160+ acres, with lots of growing hand-sheared Christmas Trees!

Sundance Farm was featured on the nationally televised **HGTV series**, "*We Bought the Farm*" documenting the search that led the owners to Sundance Farm, in season 2, episode 4 title "*Live Free or Buy in New Hampshire*". Since 2017 they've planted

thousands of seedlings including balsam, frasier, concolor, and even promising korean-balsam hybrids. It takes on average 7-10 years for a seedling to grow to a marketable size, and 2022 is the 2nd of their

> 'in-between' years. Owners are looking forward to larger selection in future seasons for your family holiday tradition.
